- Persons entering Denmark will be encouraged to take a COVID-19 test at border crossings.
- Mobile testing stations will be placed at hotspots etc. in holiday areas to make tests available to employees of shops, amusement parks, restaurants etc.
- The purpose of the increased number of tests is to monitor developments and discover any new chains of infection.
- Persons who want to enter Denmark will not be required to take a test, and tests
 will not be made on a daily basis at all border crossings or in all popular holiday
 areas.
- Foreigners arriving in Denmark will be informed about the Danish COVID-19 guidelines.
- The Danish Health Authority's recommendations on self-isolation etc. are applicable to foreign tourists testing positive for COVID-19.
- Foreigners who want to enter Denmark and show clear symptoms, such as dry cough and fever, will be refused entry at the border.
- The police will make sure that persons wanting to enter Denmark meet the conditions for entry.
- In case a foreigner who wants to enter Denmark does not meet the conditions for entry, that person will be refused entry. A summerhouse rental agreement, a hotel booking, a campsite booking or the like must be presented.
