Solemn declaration on relationship for use in connection with entry

This solemn declaration is made by the following person who confirms the correctness of the information provided by his or her signature:

I also declare that our relationship has been based on meetings in person and not only on written, telephone or other e-communication and that the purpose of this person's entry into Denmark is to visit me.

I am aware that this declaration can be used for police casework and the decision to be made by the police on entry and that the information is provided under penalty of perjury, see section 163 of the Danish Criminal Code (*straffeloven*)*.

The form must be printed and completed by the person living in Denmark who wants a visit from his or her sweetheart. When completed, the form must be sent (on paper or electronically) to the person who wants to enter Denmark. The person who wants to enter Denmark must hand in a **photocopy or printout of the form** at the point of entry. If a person who wants to enter Denmark cannot hand in a correctly completed form at entry, the relevant person can be refused entry at the border. The completed form can be used on repeated entries into Denmark.

***Section 163 of the Criminal Code:** Any person who otherwise, in writing or on another readable medium, makes a false statement or representation or confirms the correctness of facts not known to him for use in legal matters involving public authorities is sentenced to a fine or imprisonment for a term not exceeding four months.
